



TGBN member survey results summary November 2010

Question 2.






Question 4. What would make the TGBN more useful for you?

Question 7. Project suggestions

- I think the Display House project is a great initiative and could possibly lead to more commercial opportunities for the group – creating member interest and involvement.
- I'd be interested in working with TGBN on planning for a Tropical Green Build Symposium in 2011.
- A housing development that starts from a blank plan so that block size and orientation, access location, open spaces, house design etc all are working towards the lowest energy content and ongoing input to live in the house(s).
- Website with large-building appraisal and opportunity for public comment complete with photos and maps – best practice and worst practice
- Data / indicators – eg how many homes are there in the CRC region and how many have solar hot water, and how many PVs (total capacity?). What do we do with rental (renters do not benefit from the rebates which are therefore helping to skew wealth disparity further). What about apartment blocks and overcoming body corporation organisational challenge.
- Online forum on tropical green buildings would be good.
- Lift profile, establish stronger credibility and a voice, form a board, appoint a Chairperson.
- Foster stronger links with Fed, State and local Govts along with building and other sustainability industry groups and remain politically neutral .
